- Frambu is a private foundation funded by the government
- Frambu gives services to about 120 diagnosis
- About 80 people are working at Frambu
- A hotel with 74 beds

- The focus of the services has always been on the family as a whole
- Parents of children with the diagnose are being sick paid for a stay
- The services span the entire life cycle from childhood to old age
- The professionals are important targets of our service
- Frambu offers both courses and visits to the local environment in order to train the professionals





- Act relating to municipal health and care services, etc.
- Health and Care Services Act

The municipality shall ensure that all persons residing in the municipality, are provided with necessary health services

The municipality's responsibilities include all patient and consumer groups, including persons with somatic or mental illness, injury or illness, substance abuse problems, social problems or disabilities

Local guidance: Based on the patient needs Outreach services based on issues outlined by the applicant Cooperation with local support system Communication!



Medical information – consequences - care – treatment (local hospital) To ensure that the patient receive the assistance they need Kindergarten - school – work Nutrition Need for equipment – adaption of the environment Legal rights - Social support - respite care

A WORK SHEET FOR LOCAL TRAINING

The professionals from the patient s home environment applies for guidance /training

One professional at Frambu prepare the training

He/ her contact everyone (both professionals and family)— to be informed about the need of knowledge / the need of the patient/ special challenges / how have they have worked so far

The date of the visit/training is decided

How many professionals from Frambu will be involved in the training As many as possible from the home environment (local health service, kindergarten, school, work place etc.) should attend the training

A cooperation of the agenda

could include a visit at the patients home

> The main goal of the course is to ensure the best quality of life for the patients. It is desirable that all people working with individuals with the diagnose have gone through this course.

ABOUT THE TRAINING CERTIFICATION AND RECOGNITION



- Eight modules
 - Each module consists of several pages
 - At the end of the course write a reflection paper consists of three parts
 - To combine experience and learning
 - When reflection paper is submitted 100% completion of the course
 - Certificate
